

Vehicle Sharing – Scotland and Wales February 24th 2022

Due to close any proximity working increasing the risk of the COVID-19 virus being transmitted through inhalation, sharing a vehicle with someone outside your family bubble should be avoided wherever possible.

If there is a **business-critical** requirement for you to undertake a vehicle journey that requires sharing the vehicle, such as a vehicle collection or delivery, and all other reasonable options to avoid vehicle sharing have been considered and deemed unpracticable) then the following controls <u>MUST</u> be put in place to lower the potential risk of spreading the COVID virus.

It is essential to avoid long journeys, keep the travel time to an approx. 15 minutes

- 1. Select a large passenger vehicle; you <u>MUST</u> establish <u>at least 1metre+</u> between the driver's seat and the opposite rear passenger side seat (near side rear).
- 2. Passenger seating arrangements should **never** be next to the driver. Ensure the passenger is seated in the opposite rear corner seat (near side rear). Measure the distance to ensure it is more than 1 metre from the driver, the greater the distance the better.
- 3. Prior to commencing your journey ensure the vehicle has enough fuel for the journey, refer to guidance on visiting a petrol station. (11)
- 4. To minimise the time spent in the vehicle with another Associate, ensure you know the route you are taking.
- 5. Follow the guidance 'Vehicle Cleaning Guide' prior to getting in the vehicle and after you have completed the journey. Use protective seat and steering wheel covers.
- 6. Sanitise your hands before getting in a vehicle and after getting out.
- 7. Without exception, there must be no more than 2 occupants in a vehicle.
- 8. To create extra ventilation during the journey, open the windows and ensure the heater fan is **not** set to recycling.
- 9. Both associates <u>MUST</u> wear face coverings.
- 10. Whilst driving both occupants should remain facing the direction of travel, the rear seat passenger <u>MUST</u> avoid leaning forward to talk to each other.
- 11. Best practice when visiting a petrol station:
 - a. If you need to add fuel to the vehicle, do so without having a passenger in the vehicle.
 - b. Keep your distance from others
 - c. If possible, pay at the pump using a contactless card.

Any car sharing activities <u>MUST</u> be authorised by the Head of Business.

Non-essential vehicle journeys where car sharing might occur <u>MUST</u> be avoided.

Track & Trace

In the event of an Associate testing positive within a 48-hour period of sharing a vehicle with a colleague or customer, and therefore deemed to have been in close proximity, the Associate <u>MUST</u> declare who they have shared a vehicle with as part of the "Track & Trace" programme. The Associate sharing the vehicle will be required to follow the guidance in the Isolation Guidance document for their nation.
